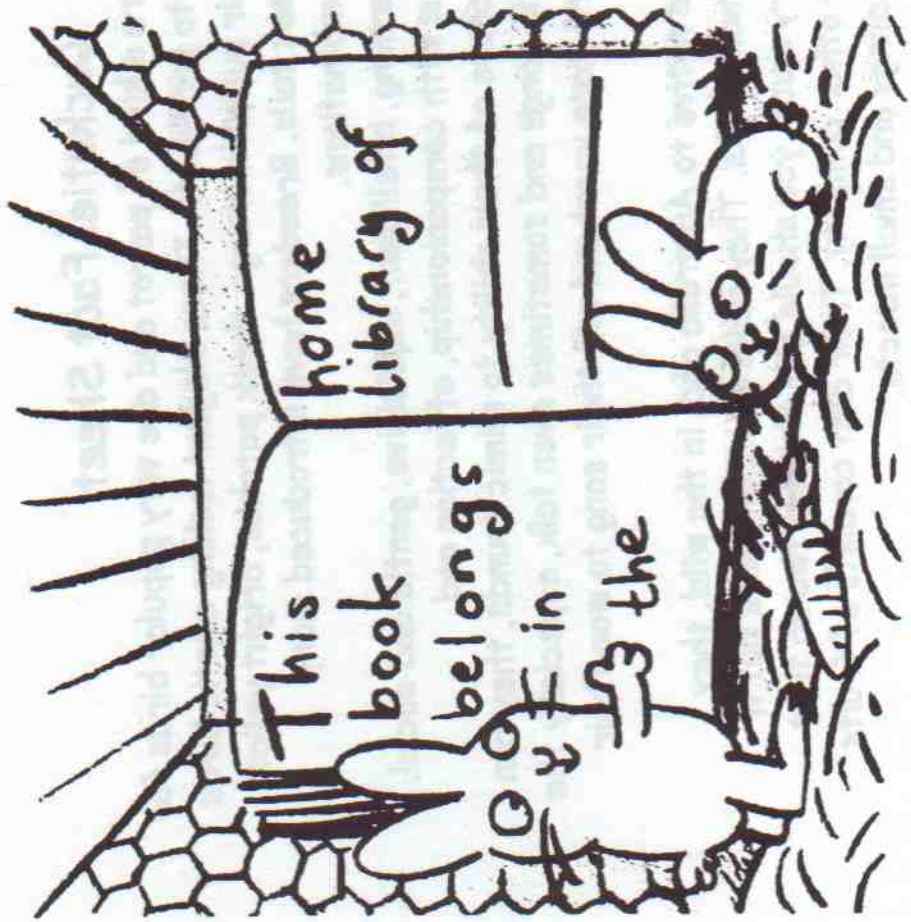

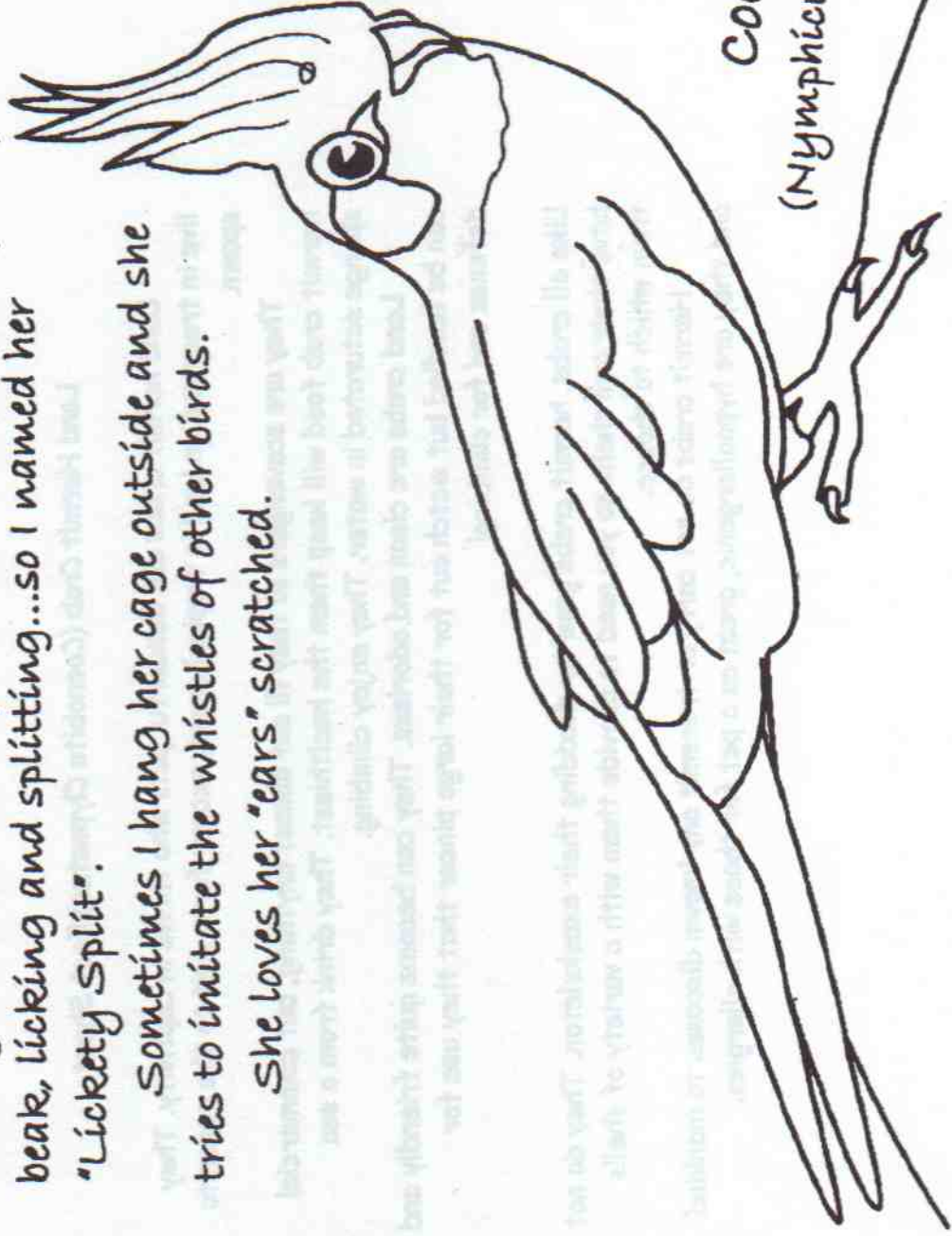

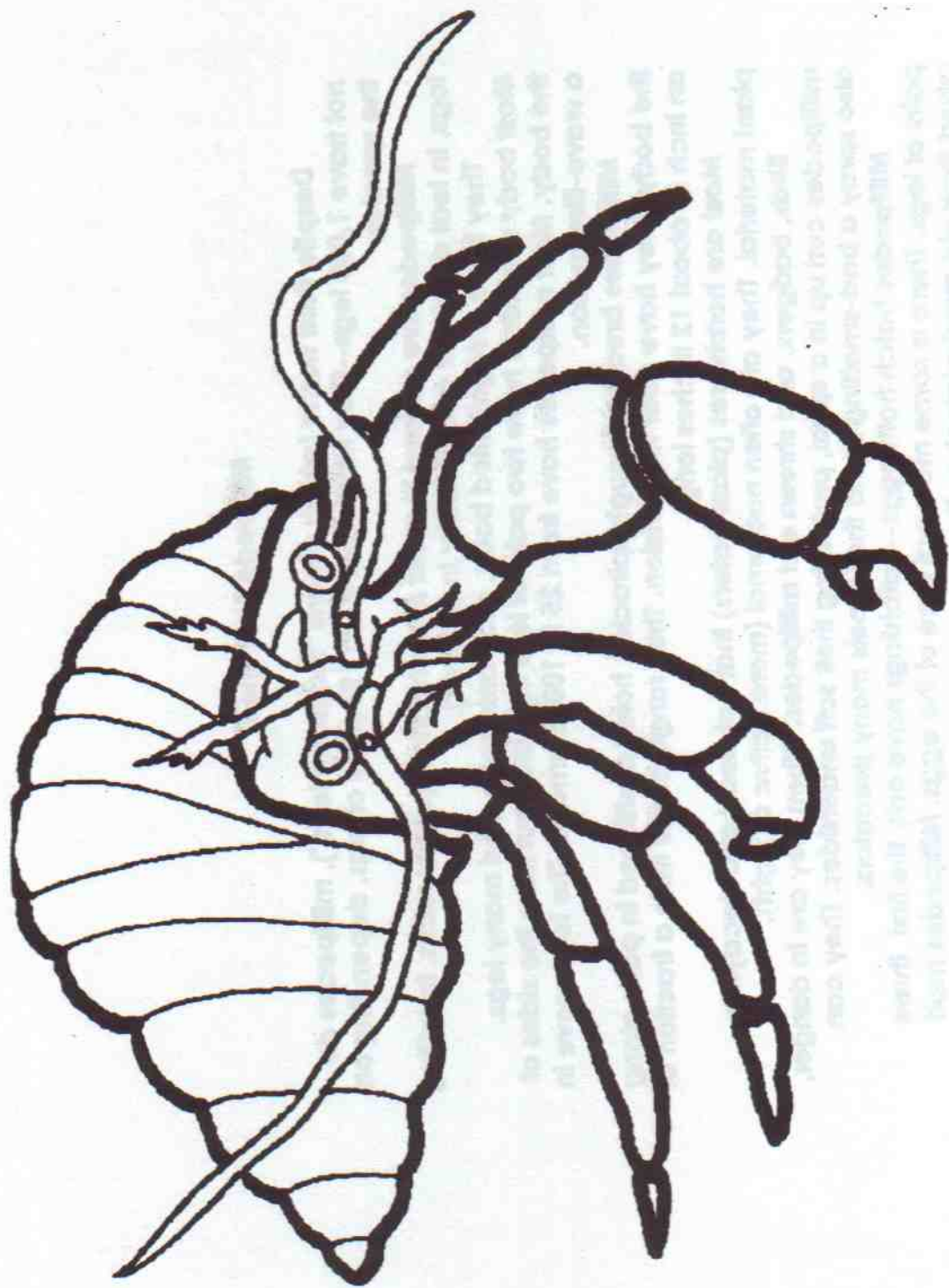
Sometimes I hang her cage outside and she tries to imitate the whistles of other birds.
